



Mary Mother of the Church

Wholly united with her Son...

Mary's role in the Church is inseparable from her union with Christ and flows directly from it. "This union of the mother with the Son in the work of salvation is made manifest from the time of Christ's virginal conception up to his death," it is made manifest above all at the hour of his Passion.

Thus, the Blessed Virgin advanced in her pilgrimage of faith and faithfully persevered in her union with her Son unto the cross. There she stood, in keeping with the divine plan and enduring with her only begotten Son the intensity of his suffering, joining herself with his sacrifice in her mother's heart, and lovingly consenting to the immolation of this victim, born of her: to be given by the same Christ Jesus dying on the cross, as a mother to his disciple, with these words: "Woman, behold your son." (CCC 964)

The Divine Child's Birth

Advent leads the Church to the Silent Night when God Himself is revealed as one of us. This season leads us to the joy of His birth. If God has joined His nature to ours, how can we ever allow our nature to be despised? If He has come to bring us Divine Life, and will return to take us to the skies, how can it be all right to throw people in the garbage? May His birth shed protection on all about to be born, and as we work to end abortion, may we "wait in joyful hope for the coming of Our Savior, Jesus Christ."



Year of Grace and Divine Mercy

(From The Diary of St. Faustina)

Meditation:

Jesus: My mercy is greater than your sins and those of the entire world. Who can measure the extent of My goodness? For you I descended from heaven to earth; for you I allowed Myself to be nailed to the cross; for you I let My Sacred Heart be pierced with a lance, thus opening wide the source of mercy for you. Come, then, with trust to draw graces from this fountain. I never reject a contrite heart. Your misery has disappeared in the depths of My mercy. Do not argue with Me about your wretchedness. You will give Me pleasure if you hand over to Me all your troubles and griefs. I shall heap upon you the treasures of My grace. (Diary, 1485).

My Prayer Response:

Lord Jesus, reveal to souls that Your mercy is greater than all the sins of the world. Draw us to You Sacred Heart, so our miseries may disappear in the depths of Your mercy. Have mercy on us all.



Eucharistic Revival

This year is a National Eucharistic Revival movement for all parishes. This is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, the Most Blessed Sacrament.

"The Eucharist is also the sacrifice of the Church. The Church which is the Body of Christ participates in the offering of her Head. With him, she herself is offered whole and entire. She unites herself to his intercession with the Father for all men.

In the Eucharist the sacrifice of Christ becomes also the sacrifice of the members of his Body. The lives of the faithful, their praise, sufferings, prayer, and work, are united with those of Christ and with his total offering, and so acquire a new value. Christ's sacrifice present on the altar makes it possible for all generations of Christians to be united with his offering. In the catacombs the Church is often represented as a woman in prayer, arms outstretched in the praying position. Like Christ who stretched out his arms on the cross, through him, with him, and in him, she offers herself and intercedes for all men." (CCC 1368)

HEALING MASS

December 20th at 11:00 am

As baptized Catholics, every one of us is rich in the gifts of the Holy Spirit, given to us in baptism and deepened in Confirmation. Among them is the gift of healing, which makes us signs of God's power and presence and allows us to make others whole for the good of the Church.

A healing Mass is a normal Mass, but it has a special focus on God's healing power; this will be reflected in the (songs,) prayers, and scripture readings.

During the Mass, the celebrant prays for those attending and anoints them with blessed oil. The priest also prays for someone else's needs as requested.

During the healing service you may experience someone falling backward and then resting on the ground. This is called being *slain in the Spirit*; it is simply an indication that the person is overcome by an awareness of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and is resting peacefully.

Remember that the healing you seek may occur over a period of time and in a way which is different from what you expected. Be consistent by praying continuously for your healing.

A healing may be physical, spiritual, or emotional; it may be sudden, or it may happen gradually, in God's time. A healing may also manifest itself in a manner that is different from what was expected. Regardless of the nature of the healing, perseverance in prayer is necessary for the healing to continue.

Of course, God alone can restore someone to health: the priest is only a vehicle for God's healing power.

The late Pope Benedict XVI wrote, "Healing is an essential dimension of the apostolic mission.... It can even be said that Christianity is a 'therapeutic religion, a religion of healing."
