Priests for Life

Christmas: A Gift of Life

"The Gospel of life is at the heart of Jesus' message. Lovingly received day after day by the Church, it is to be preached with dauntless fidelity as "good news" to the people of every age and culture.

At the dawn of salvation, it is the Birth of a Child which is proclaimed as joyful news: "I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Lk 2:10-11).

The source of this "great joy" is the Birth of the Savior; but Christmas also reveals the full meaning of every human birth, and the joy which accompanies the Birth of the Messiah is thus seen to be the foundation and fulfilment of joy at every child born into the world (cf. Jn 16:21)" (St. John Paul II, "The Gospel of Life," n.1).

Year of Grace and Divine Mercy

(From The Diary of St. Faustina)

Meditation:

Jesus: True, My child, all that is painful. But there is no way to heaven except the way of the cross. I followed it first. You must learn that is the shortest and surest way.

Jesus: It is because you are not of this world that the world hates you. First it persecuted Me. Persecution is a sign that you are following in My footsteps faithfully (Diary, 1487)

My Prayer Response:

Lord Jesus, help me to learn with my heart what I know with my head, that the cross is the only, shortest, and surest way to heaven. You led the way first. Give me the strength to follow.



Eucharistic Revival

This year is a National Eucharistic Revival movement for all parishes. This is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, the Most Blessed Sacrament.

"The Eucharistic sacrifice is also offered for the faithful departed who have died in Christ but are not yet wholly purified," so that they may be able to enter in the light and peace of Christ Put this body anywhere!

Don't trouble yourselves about it! I simply ask you to remember me at the Lord's altar wherever you are. Then, we pray [in the anaphora] for the holy fathers and bishops who have fallen asleep, and in general for all who have fallen asleep before us, in the belief that it is a great benefit to the souls on whose behalf the supplication is offered, while the holy and tremendous Victim is present by offering to God our supplication for those who have fallen asleep, if they have sinned, we...offer Christ sacrificed for the sins of all, and so render favorable, for them and for us, the God who loves man. (CCC 1371)

HEALING MASS

December 20th at 11:00 am

As baptized Catholics, every one of us is rich in the gifts of the Holy Spirit, given to us in baptism and deepened in Confirmation. Among them is the gift of healing, which makes us signs of God's power and presence and allows us to make others whole for the good of the Church.

A healing Mass is a normal Mass, but it has a special focus on God's healing power; this will be reflected in the (songs,) prayers, and scripture readings.

During the Mass, the celebrant prays for those attending and anoints them with blessed oil. The priest also prays for someone else's needs as requested.

During the healing service you may experience someone falling backward and then resting on the ground. This is called being *slain in the Spirit*; it is simply an indication that the person is overcome by an awareness of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and is resting peacefully.

Remember that the healing you seek may occur over a period of time and in a way which is different from what you expected. Be consistent by praying continuously for your healing.

A healing may be physical, spiritual, or emotional; it may be sudden, or it may happen gradually, in God's time. A healing may also manifest itself in a manner that is different from what was expected. Regardless of the nature of the healing, perseverance in prayer is necessary for the healing to continue.

Of course, God alone can restore someone to health: the priest is only a vehicle for God's healing power.

The late Pope Benedict XVI wrote, "Healing is an essential dimension of the apostolic mission.... It can even be said that Christianity is a 'therapeutic religion, a religion of healing.'"
