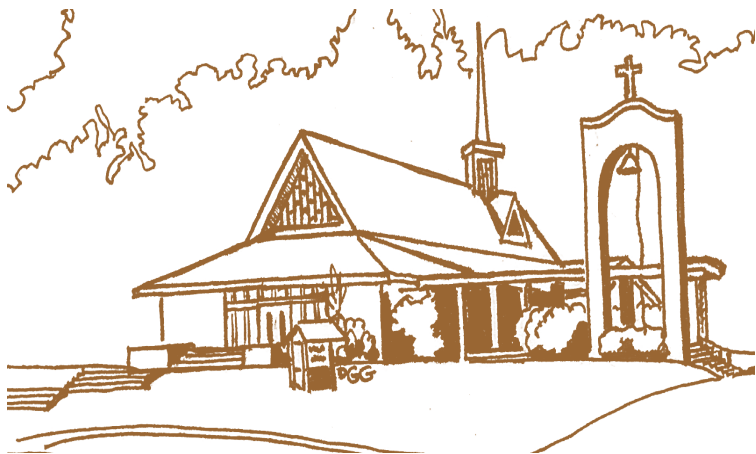

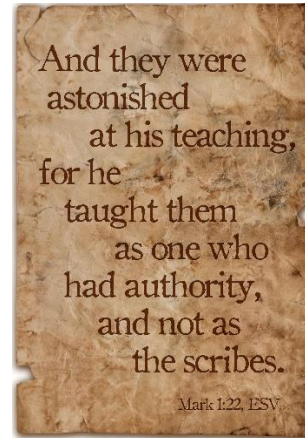

## Cultural Prayer Gardens

Preliminary plans for outdoor prayer gardens for our culturally diverse Parish are on display in the foyer of the church. This is an effort to recognize our Vietnamese, Hispanic, Philippine, and Polish and European communities and allow them to share their cultures where all can visit. The garden areas are to include signage, statues, benches, and shrub and tree plantings. This will be adjacent to Mason Kopacki's "Stations of the Cross" Eagle Scout project. These projects will make use of and beautify almost an acre and a half of the wooded behind our Parish church and hall.

**About Our Faith!**

**Mary- Eschatological Icon of the Church**

After speaking of the Church, her origin, mission, and destiny, we can find no better way to conclude that by looking to Mary. In her we contemplate what the Church already is in her mystery on her own "pilgrimage of faith," and what she will be in the homeland at the end of her journey. There, "in the glory of the Most Holy and Undivided Trinity," "in the communion of all the saints," the Church is awaited by the one she venerates as Mother of her Lord and as her own mother. In the meantime, the Mother of Jesus, in the glory which she possesses in body and soul in heaven, is the image and beginning of the Church as it is to be perfected the world to come. Likewise, she shines forth on earth, until the day of the Lord shall come, a sign of certain hope and comfort to the pilgrim People of God. (CCC 972)



### Priests for Life

#### From the Catechism...

“Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person -- among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life. “Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you” (Jer 1:5; cf Job 10:8-12; Ps 22:10-11). “My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately wrought in the depths of the earth” (Ps. 139:15). Since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion. This teaching has not changed and remains unchangeable.” -- Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 2270-2271

### Year of Grace and Divine Mercy (From The Diary of St. Faustina)

#### Meditation:

The Lord said to me, The loss of each soul plunges Me into mortal sadness. You always console Me when you pray for sinners. The prayer most pleasing to Me is prayer for the conversion of sinners. Know, My daughter, that this prayer is always heard and answered (Diary, 1397)

March 25, 1938. Today, I saw the suffering Lord Jesus. He leaned down toward me and whispered softly, **My daughter help Me to save sinners.** Suddenly, a burning desire to save souls entered my soul. When I recovered my senses, I knew just how I was to help souls, and I prepared myself for greater sufferings (Diary, 1645)

#### My Prayer Response:

Lord Jesus, I want to respond to Your “mortal sadness” caused by the loss of each soul. Give me a “burning desire to save souls” like that of St. Faustina. Give me the graces to even suffer for the conversion of sinners.



### Eucharistic Revival

This year is a National Eucharistic Revival movement for all parishes. This is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, the Most Blessed Sacrament.

The Council of Trent summarizes the Catholic faith by declaring: “Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread in to the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change, the holy Catholic Church, has fittingly and properly called **transubstantiation**. (CCC 1376)

**Bishop Knestout on Pope Francis' Use of Blessings:**  
**A Letter to Diocesan Priests**

On January 4<sup>th</sup>, Bishop Knestout sent a letter to Diocesan priests as guidance on the use of “blessings” as per Pope Francis’ recent declaration. He states the declaration does “not entail as significant a change to Church practice.” The “secular media and others” have failed to give adequate context of what is important in “Church teaching, i.e., how God acts toward us.” \*

“God’s way is one of tenderness, love that is patient, kind and generous.” We the Church should offer similar “care for one another,” including those outside the Church.

“No teaching [of the Church] has been changed.” The context is in how blessings are offered – a distinction not often discussed among Catholics.

There are different kinds of blessings and the Pope’s declaration covers blessings “that are spontaneous, informal, non-liturgical, and brief.” \*

A blessing is to be withheld\* when the request is for the affirmation or celebration of a state of life considered sinful by the Church. However, a personal blessing can be of someone who is struggling with some difficulty for which they ask for a blessing – and is encouraged. Such spontaneous blessings are “intended to express God’s desire that we receive his grace and help to an increase in holiness.”

The priest needs to be assured of or emphasize that the request for a blessing is being made not to approve of or confirm or validate an irregular situation\* or same sex couples, but is truly a faithful person who is striving “for continued conversion and a life of holiness consistent with the practice of the Church” and in no way confers\* a liturgical blessing on any “union that presumes to be a marriage or to an extra-marital sexual practice” (taken from the Pope’s *Fiducia Supplicans: On the Meaning of Blessings* or “FS”).

The Holy Father’s declaration is to develop a broader understanding of “blessings.” There are blessings that descend from God upon man; there are blessings that ascend from earth to heaven, i.e., God.

Blessings should be approached with an attitude of faith and fatherly mercy (FS). “When one asks for a blessing...they are expressing a petition for God’s assistance, a plea to live better.”

A spontaneous blessing (refer to the Book of Blessings) is meant for “everyone...even if he or she lives in situations that are not ordered to the Creator’s plan...God never turns away anyone who approaches him!” (FS)
