About Our Faith:

The Mysteries of Jesus' Public Life

The baptism of Jesus- Jesus' public life begins with his baptism by John in the Jordan. John preaches "a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." A crowd of sinners-tax collectors and soldiers, Pharisees and Sadducees, and prostitutes- come to be baptized by him. "Then Jesus appears." The Baptist hesitates, but Jesus insists and receives baptism. Then the Holy Spirit, in the form of a dove comes upon Jesus and a voice from heaven proclaims, "This is my beloved Son," This is the manifestation ("Epiphany") of Jesus as Messiah of Israel and Son of God. (CCC 535)

Priests for Life

The cleansing power of water

Today's first reading speaks to us of Noah's Ark. The flood that God sent upon the world in Noah's day was a cleansing of evil. Now, God cleanses us not by floods, but by the waters of baptism, which bring to us a whole new kind of life: the life of God within us.

Our special efforts in Lent to come closer to God are a response to what has already happened to us! Because we have received the new life of God, we have to reform our lives and live as his sons and daughters. We have to become who we already are. The holy water we use when we come in and out of Church is a reminder of the cleansing waters of baptism, and a reminder of the new life we are called to live.

God is a God of life, and therefore we are the People of Life. This Lent, let's look for ways to foster respect for life, especially the sick, the disabled, and the unborn.

Year of Grace and Divine Mercy (From The Diary of St. Faustina)

Meditation:

That evening, I remained in the chapel a little longer. I talked to the Lord about a certain soul. Encouraged by His goodness. I said, "Jesus, You gave me this Father who understands my inspirations, and now You are taking him away from me again. What am I going to do in the Vilinius? I don't know anyone there, and even the dialect of the people there is foreign to me. And the Lord said to me, **Do not fear; I will not leave you to yourself**. My soul drowned itself in a prayer of thanksgiving for all the graces that the Lord had granted me through the meditation of Father Andrasz. Suddenly, I remembered the vision in which I had seen that priest between the confessional land the altar, trusting that I would meet him (Fr. Sopocko) someday. And the words I had heard came back vividly: **He will help you to fulfill My will here on earth** (Diary, 258)

My Prayer Response:

Lord Jesus, thank You for providing two holy and knowledgeable priests as spiritual directors to St. Faustina.)



Eucharistic Revival

This year is a National Eucharistic Revival movement for all parishes. This is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Worship of the Eucharist.

The tabernacle was first intended for the reservation of the Eucharist in a worthy place so that it could be brought to the sick and those absent outside of Mass.

As faith in the real presence of Christ in his Eucharist deepened, the Church became conscious of the meaning of silent adoration of the Lord present under the Eucharistic species.

It is for this reason that the tabernacle should be located in an especially worthy place in the church and should be constructed in such a way that it emphasizes and manifests the truth of the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. (CCC 1378)

More News from Knights of Columbus

Bernadette Soubirous was gathering firewood near her home in southern France on Feb. 11, 1858, when the Blessed Mother appeared to her for the first time. Two weeks later, Mary told her to dig in the ground, revealing the spring whose holy waters have healed so many in the 166 years since. For the last decade, the Knights of Columbus has helped both American and Ukrainian service members make pilgrimages to pray for peace and healing at the Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes.



The Power of Lourdes for Ukraine

Pilgrims to Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine in France often describe it as a place full of joy and peace. Therefore, the sight of thousands of military personnel processing through the shrine in uniform may be jarring to some.

Ukraine has continued to send a small group of soldiers, chaplains and mothers of fallen soldiers to Lourdes for the annual International Military Pilgrimage despite the demands of war. At the same time, pilgrims with the Order's <u>Warriors to Lourdes</u> program have shown their solidarity by preparing thousands of prayer sets, containing rosaries, holy water and more, for Ukrainian troops.

Rebuilding in Maui

In the months since Sacred Hearts School in Lahaina, Maui, was destroyed by fire in August 2023, Knights have helped to keep the school up and running as the community rebuilds. "I'm just in awe of the Knights of Columbus and the overwhelming support they have shown," said Sacred Hearts principal, Tonata Losesio.


