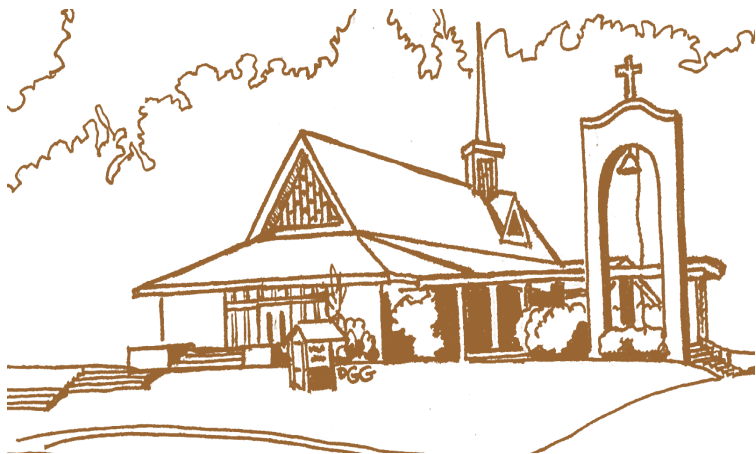

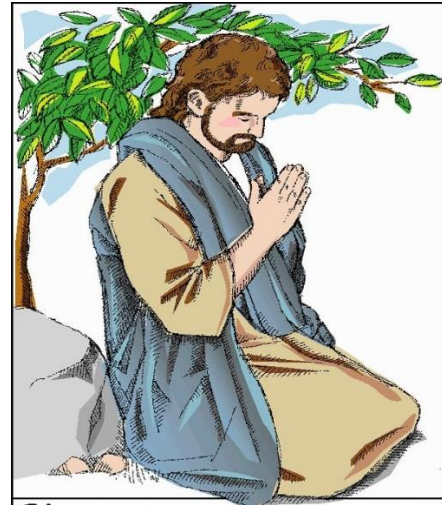

Mary- Eschatological Icon of the Church

After speaking of the Church, her origin, mission, and destiny, we can find no better way to conclude that by looking to Mary. In her we contemplate what the Church already is in her mystery on her own "pilgrimage of faith," and what she will be in the homeland at the end of her journey. There, "in the glory of the Most Holy and Undivided Trinity," "in the communion of all the saints," the Church is awaited by the one she venerates as Mother of her Lord and as her own mother. In the meantime, the Mother of Jesus, in the glory which she possesses in body and soul in heaven, is the image and beginning of the Church as it is to be perfected the world to come. Likewise, she shines forth on earth, until the day of the Lord shall come, a sign of certain hope and comfort to the pilgrim People of God. (CCC 972)

Priests for Life

Abortion Survivors

Child psychiatrist Philip Ney relates, "A woman reported telling her nine-year old son about her abortion, which had taken place years before he was born. He said, 'I knew, Mom, that there was something wrong. I always have nightmares about knives and my mother killing me. I have an imaginary brother who wants to kill me. If you had not aborted the other, would you have aborted me?'" (Abortion Survivors, p.36).

This is a story repeated more times than most people realize, and representing a societal and pastoral problem whose proportions are greater today than at any previous time in history: the phenomenon of tens of millions of abortion survivors.

It is clear that abortion's primary victim is the child who is killed. It has also become increasingly clear that to kill the child is to harm the mother and father as well. What is not always so well known, however, is that abortion makes its impact felt on those who have had a sibling aborted, and that this impact is felt in surprising and astonishing ways, which also have wider implications for the whole of society.

Year of Grace and Divine Mercy

(From The Diary of St. Faustina)

Meditation:

I understand Your words, Lord, and the magnitude of the mercy that ought to shine in my soul. Jesus: **I know, My daughter that you understand it and that you do everything within your power. But write this for the many souls who are often worried because they do not I have the material means with which to carry out an act of mercy. Yet spiritually mercy, which requires neither permissions nor storehouses, is much more meritorious and is within the grasp of every soul. If a soul does not exercise mercy somehow or other, it will not obtain My mercy on the day of Judgment** (Diary, 1317).

My Prayer Response:

My Jesus, thank You for teaching us through St. Faustina about "spiritual mercies" when we do not have material goods to give. We can always encourage other by our word, by our prayer, and by our kindness- and especially by sacrifice lovingly accomplished, which You, Jesus, called **exercising mercy in spirit.** (Diary, 1316)



Eucharistic Revival

This year is a National Eucharistic Revival movement for all parishes. This is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, the Most Blessed Sacrament.

The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist. Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts, in such a way that the breaking of the bread does not divide Christ. (CCC 1377)

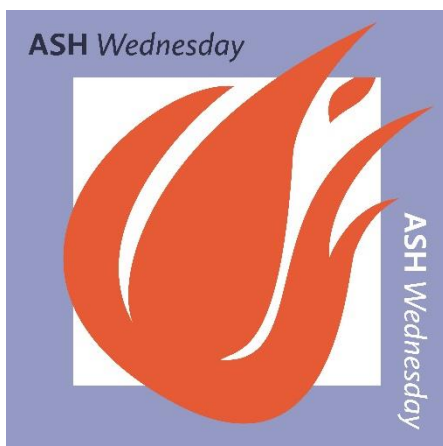
Who should attend this retreat?

Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church

November 19, 2023

Members Present: Father Oscar, Deacon Kevin, Tiffany Smith, Terry Frederick, Bob Ryalls, Greg Walthour, Kay Shaw, Sal Inga, Jose Velazquez, Jim Vadas

Additional Visitors Present: Jonathan Kopacki, Glenn Shaw

Meeting Called to Order: Tiffany called meeting to order.

Prayer: Tiffany led with the prayer, Come Holy Spirit.

Elections: Chair: Tiffany agreed to remain the Chair for an additional year

Vice-Chair: Sal placed his name in nomination.

Secretary: Jim agreed to take the position for another year.

Nominations were closed, a motion was made and seconded, and the vote was unanimous.

Roof Issue: Tiffany had sent out all previous minutes of the Facilities Committee as well as the TAM (roof engineers) letter/report. Bob said the letter/report was sent to Shawn Lazar (Diocese) and the Diocesan attorney to get a response after Thanksgiving. The letter/report would then be sent to Sharon, Hardesty's primary contact, who is Hardesty's Office Project Manager. We feel we are on a good path going forward.

International Dinner: Jim said he and Jonathan talked about how to proceed with the International Dinner planned for Saturday, January 27th with February 3rd as a "snow date." Janice has reserved the hall for those dates. The difficulty is that if tickets are sold, all the food preparation must be done in a Health Dept.-approved kitchen, which ours is; but to get several nationality foods made in a short time is impossible. We talked about getting restaurants of various nationalities to bring food for the dinner. Finally, the suggestion was made do an International Pot-Luck where we would ask for donations. This way, our various nationalities could make and bring in their favorite dishes. Jim will reach out to representatives of the different cultures within our Parish. This will be a good first step in once again holding an International Dinner.

Cultural Prayer Gardens: Jim asked for direction on planning the Cultural Prayer Gardens in the wooded area behind the Boogaard Hall. Mason Kopacki's Eagle Scout project will be in the wooded area adjacent but is behind the Church and parking lot. Plans for the gardens would be three at this time: a Vietnamese prayer garden, a Hispanic prayer garden, and a Polish/European prayer garden. Signs would be erected in each area to present each culture's contributions to the Parish. Suggestions could include paths made to benches, altars – perhaps with statues to Mary that are known to the different cultures, and plantings of shrubs, flowers and trees. Those with gardening and landscaping interests could form a group as well as those that could help in the construction. Susan Thompson's and Melissa Inga's names were suggested as gardening information assistance. Jim mentioned Alfred Jones, Joanna Ellingson, and Erin Hayden as additional parishioners with gardening interests. Jim mentioned that Jose and Eston and others have been working on clearing the area. Jim said that the Knights of Columbus had already

donated \$1,000 to the Parish towards expenses of the project. It was suggested that an initial meeting of those who could help in planning to meet on some upcoming Saturday at 10:00 or 11:00 am to end with a lunch provided by the Knights (Sal and Jonathan thought this would be agreeable).

Father led us in a closing prayer.

Next meeting date will be December 31st at 10:15
