Year of Grace and Divine Mercy (From The Diary of St. Faustina)

Meditation:

September 25, 1937. When I learned how great are the difficulties in this whole work, I went to the Lord and said, "Jesus, don't You see how they are hindering Your work?" And I heard a voice in my soul: Do as much as is in your power, and don't worry about the rest. These difficulties prove that this work is Mine. Be at peace so long as you do all that is in your power (Diary, 1295)

The Lord said to me: It should be of no concern to you how anyone else acts: you are to be My living reflection through love and mercy. I answered, "Lord, but they often take advantage of my goodness." That makes no difference, My daughter. That is no concern of yours. As for you, be always merciful toward other people, and especially toward sinners (Dairy, 1446).

Lord Jesus, in difficulties in my work and relationships, may I rejoice and do what is in my power with peace. May I always be merciful.

The Mysteries of Jesus' Public Life

Jesus' temptations- The evangelists indicate the salvific meaning of this mysterious event: Jesus is the new Adam who remained faithful just where the first Adam had given in to temptation. Jesus fulfills Israel's vocation perfectly: in contrast to those who had once provoked God during forty years in the desert, Christ reveals himself as God's Servant, totally obedient to the divine will. In this, Jesus is the devil's conqueror: he "binds the strong man" to take back his plunder. Jesus' victory over the tempter in the desert anticipates victory at the Passion, the supreme act of obedience of his filial love for the Father. (CCC 539)

Thanks also for the excellent turnout of Brother Knights and members of their families who cooked and packaged the food for take outs and served dinners to those eating at the Hall.










Becoming a Knight!!

Obituary for Russell Edward Smith

On March 5th, 2024, the Reverend Russell Edward Smith entered into his final rest. Rusty, as he was called by everyone, was born to Frank Ernest Smith and Mildred Blanche Sweeny Smith on March 22, 1954, in the old Bell Hospital, Williamsburg, Virginia.

In his earliest days he attended Matthew Whaley
Elementary School and then continued his upper-level grade
schooling at Walsingham Academy, (Sisters of Mercy of
Merion,) for the period of grades 7 through 12. In
preparation for the Priesthood, he attended Duns Scotus
College, Southfield Michigan. Upon completion of his
studies at Duns Scotus, he continued his education with
Catholic University, Washington D.C. to be awarded a
Master of Divinity, (STM.)

Having finished his studies at Catholic University, he took his interests further to Rome with the completion of a Doctorate in Sacred Theology (S.T.D.) with Pontificia Universitas Lateranensis. Academia Alfonsiana, Rome. Returning from Rome Rusty did some time with the Catholic Diocese of Richmond then took a post with the Archdiocese of Boston as Moral Theologian. He then went back to Richmond, and then to Saint Louis functioning each time in the same capacity until he finally returned to The Diocese of Richmond as both Moral Theologian and Parish Priest. He functioned as Moral Theologian to the Virginia Commonwealth University's Health Care System.

He is survived by a number of cousins in the greater Williamsburg area. He retired early because of medical reasons and maintained his residence in Toano, Virginia.



Eucharistic Revival

"Take this and eat it, all of you": Communion

The Lord addresses an invitation to us, urging us to receive him in the sacrament o the Eucharist: "Truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. To respond to this invitation we must prepare ourselves for so great and so holy a moment. St. Paul urges us to examine our conscience: "Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a man examine himself and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For any one who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself." Anyone conscious of a grave sin must receive the sacrament of Reconciliation before coming to communion. (CCC 1384-1385)
